Bo Jackson, born in Bessemer, Ala., was drafted to the New York Yankees out of high school but chose to become an Auburn Tiger. He played for Auburn from 1982 to 1985. While at Auburn, Jackson ran track, played football and baseball. He won the 1985 Heisman Trophy which represents the nation’s outstanding college player. He was the first athlete to be selected to all star games in two different sports. In his professional career, Jackson played for the Kansas City Royals, Chicago White Sox, California Angels

Samford Stadium at Hitchcock Field at Plainsman Park



W. James “Jimmy” Samford, Jr. Plainsman Park has hosted numerous regionals but most recently had the privilege of hosting President George W. Bush in 2002.

Samford Stadium at Hitchcock Field at Plainsman Park was voted the best collegiate baseball facility in the country by Baseball America in 2003. The 10-year old stadium seats 4,096 including state-of-the art concessions, restrooms, and ticket and press facilities. The field is named in honor of Billy and Jimmy Hitchcock, two noteworthy athletes in the 1930s and Auburn Board of Trustee Member
